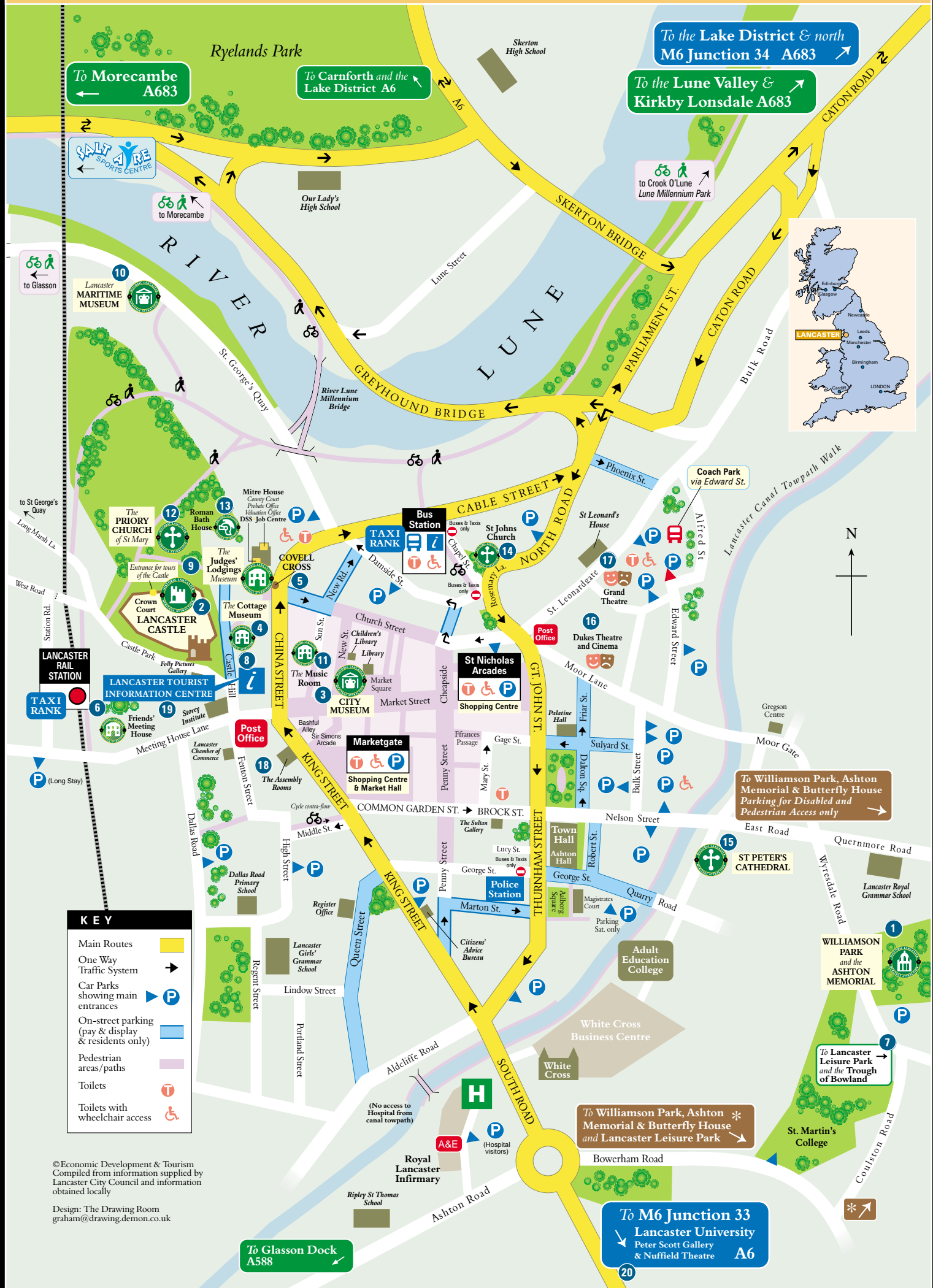

1. Williamson Park



Williamson Park, Ashton Memorial Folly and Tropical Butterfly House, Mini-Beasts, Foreign Bird House, Conservation Garden & Exhibition Gallery. Set in 54 acres of landscaped gardens with breathtaking views.

2. Lancaster Castle



Owned by Her Majesty the Queen as 'Duke of Lancaster'. Tours normally include early dungeons, Shire Hall, Grand Jury Room, Drop Room & Hadrian's Tower.

3. City Museum



Fine Georgian Sessions House stylishly showing local life from neolithic age to present. Museum of King's Own Royal Regiment (Lancaster). Changing Exhibitions.

4. Cottage Museum



No. 15 Castle Hill is now a small furnished museum evoking the life of an artisan's family around 1825.

5. Covell Cross

Marks the site of an ancient cross. Named after Thomas Covell a former owner of the Judges' Lodgings and Keeper of the Castle.

6. Friends Meeting House

Built in 1708, later enlarged. Quakers have worshipped on this site since 1677.

9. Judges' Lodgings Museum



Reputedly the City's oldest town house, includes collection of furniture made by Lancaster cabinet makers Gillow and The Museum of Childhood

10. Maritime Museum



Award winning museum in 18th Century riverside Custom House designed by Richard Gillow, renowned furniture maker.

11. Music Room

Built around 1735 as a garden house with the finest Baroque plaster-work in the North West.

12. Priory & Parish Church of St Mary



Founded in 1094 by Roger de Poitou on the site of earlier Saxon church and Roman remains. Mostly mediaeval, King's Own Memorial Chapel built early this century. Refectory offering light refreshments.

13. Roman Bath House & Wery Wall Remains

Off from Vicarage Lane, remains of Roman bath-house and fragment of 4th century fort wall.

14. St John's Church



Superb Georgian church open on special occasions for lunchtime and evening concerts, recitals, lectures and tours.

15. St Peter's Cathedral



Designed by distinguished Lancaster architect, E.G. Paley in the style of 1300. 'A fine inspiring building... impressively detailed'. Nicolaus Pevsner.

16. Dukes Theatre and Cinema



Much-praised repertory theatre, cinema shows, leading quality films. Public Bar.

17. Grand Theatre



In continuous use for 200 years. Guided tours of the Edwardian interior, haunted by the ghost of actress Sarah Siddons. Frequently changing programme.

18. Assembly Rooms & Penny's Almshouses

The Assembly Rooms (now an indoor market) provided income from social events for the adjacent almshouses which are still in use as private dwellings (1720) named after William Penny.

19. Storey Institute, Meeting House Lane



Imposing Paley & Austin building. Frequently changing exhibitions and lunchtime lectures.
